**Students will need morning tea and lunch for Tuesday.** We will stop on the way for morning tea and eat our lunch in Greenbushes. All other meals, including lunch for the return journey, will be provided.

**NO snacks and/or lollies** - The camp school provides excellent meals and a variety of snacks throughout the day.

**Medicine:** No child is to carry their own medicines. All medical requirements are to be placed in a sealed bag. Please write your child's name and dosage instructions on the bag and hand to Mrs Swart on Tuesday morning. The teachers will be responsible for dispensing medicine at the appropriate time. The only exception to this is an asthma puffer and/or EpiPen which students **must** carry on their person at all times. It may be appropriate for students in this instance to carry their puffer or pen in a pouch around their waist.
